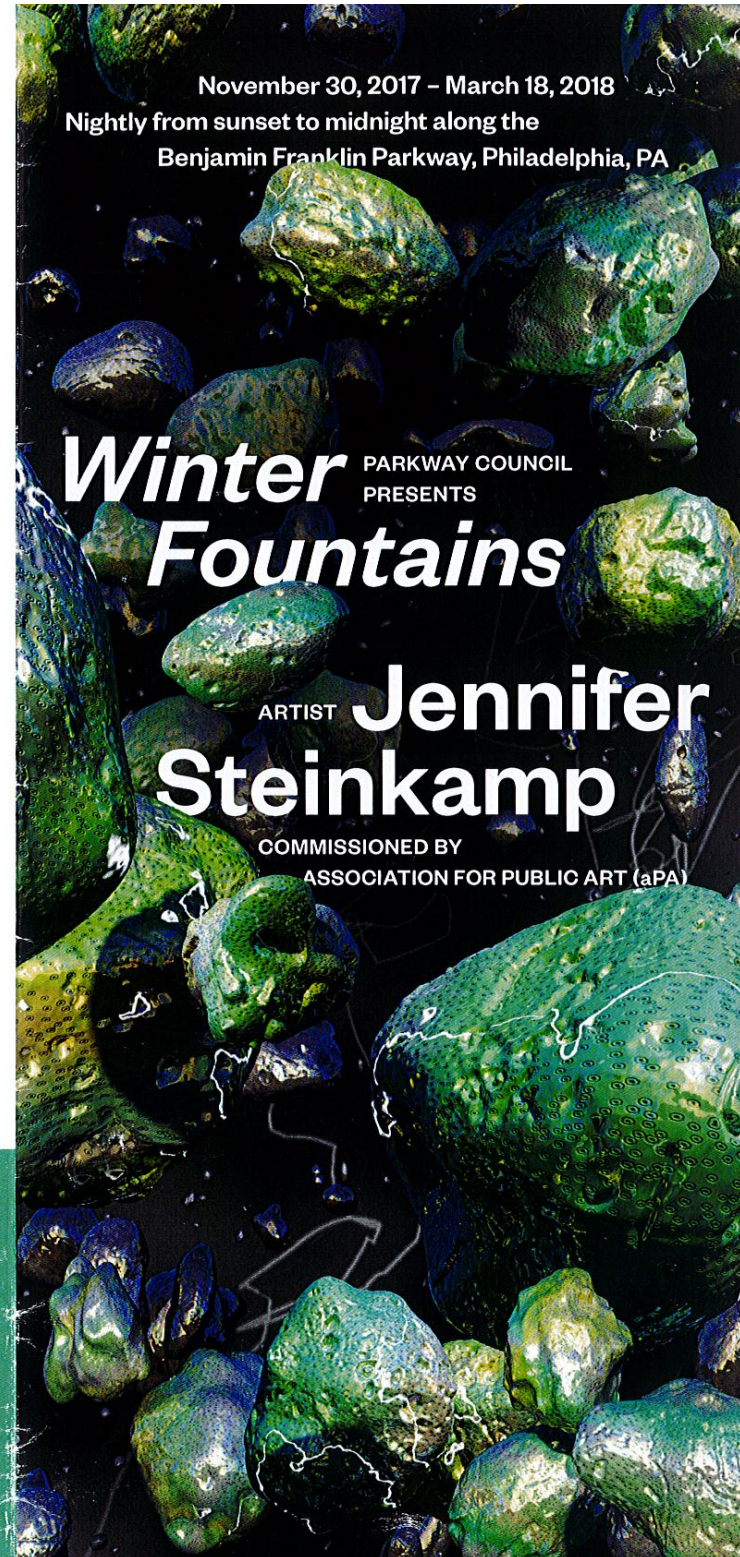

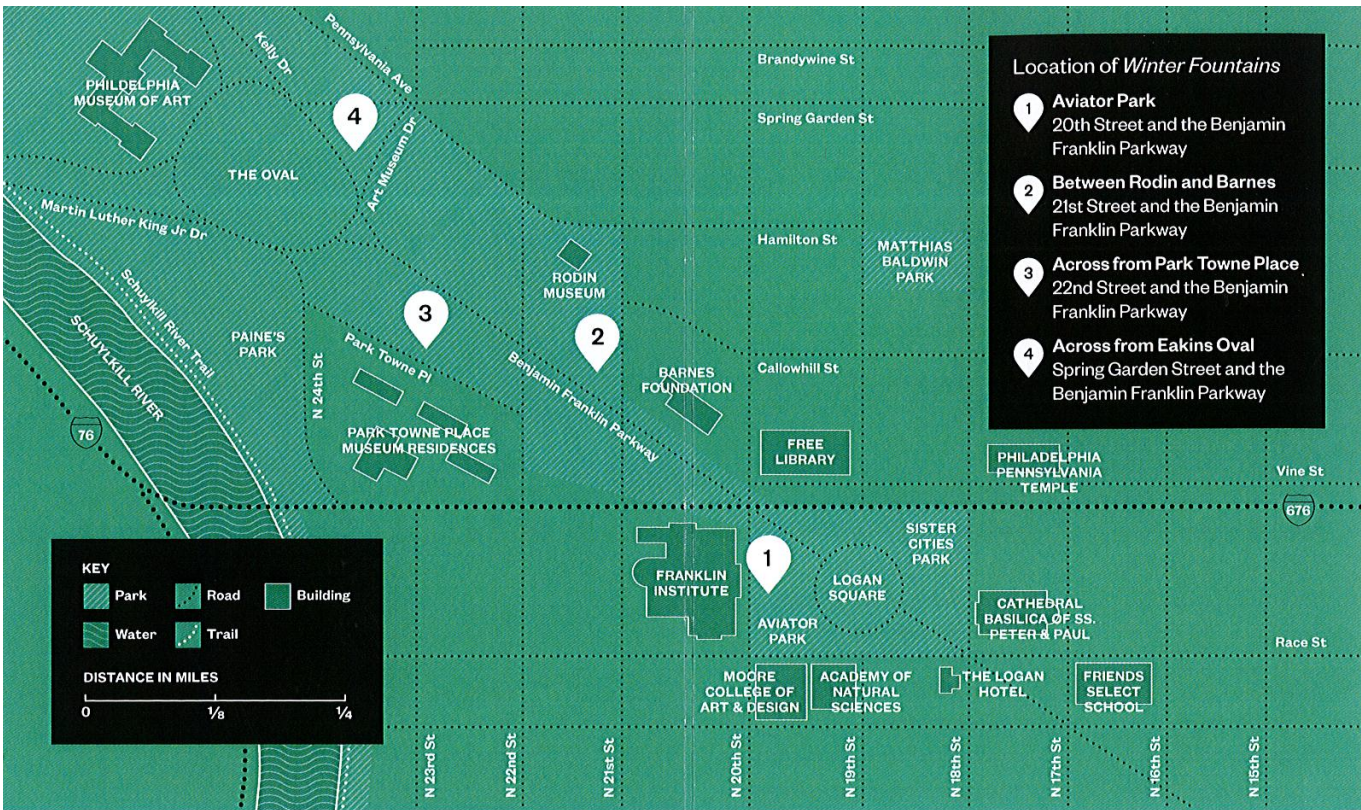

Inspired by the signature fountains of the Parkway, four mesmerizing and enchanting *Winter Fountains* — 13ft high and 26ft wide architectural domes — will glow with Jennifer Steinkamp's dream-like video projections. The animations, each in distinct hues of green, blue, red, or yellow, allude to the creative and scientific explorations represented by the nearby Parkway institutions. Illuminating and redefining the boulevard at night, the project serves as a centerpiece for the yearlong Parkway 100 centennial celebration.

JENNIFER STEINKAMP, world renowned artist and professor in the Department of Design Media Arts at UCLA, works with video and new media to explore and share ideas about space, motion, and perception. Her installation art has been the subject of exhibitions at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art; the Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego, California; the Albright-Knox Gallery, Buffalo, New York; Mass MoCA, North Adams, Massachusetts; and the Sundance Film Festival, Park City, Utah. Her art has toured worldwide with the band U2. Steinkamp has received many awards and recognitions. She was the J. Paul Getty Artist in Residence in 2010–2011, the U.S. representative to the 11th Cairo International Biennale in Egypt, and she received an Honorary Doctorate from the Art Center College of Design, Pasadena. Steinkamp was featured in *Time Square Arts: Midnight Moment* in New York City (2016) and is included in many prominent public art collections. She lives and works in Los Angeles, California.
